Ski Touring Equipment List

Waterproof, breathable jacket

Waterproof trousers ski pants

Warm Gloves and thinner fleece gloves

Thermal Tops and mid-layer pull over

Soft shell jacket

Light weight down jacket

Mountain trousers

Warm hat

Ski socks (calf length) and spares

Buff, neck sock

Map – (optional) White Risk or Swiss Mobility phone app

Compass and whistle (optional)

Altimeter (watch) and GPS (optional)

Head torch (small LED type)

Rucksack 40 litres ideally a ski touring rucksack with external pocket for shovel/probe

Small personal first aid kit (tape for blisters and pain killers such as aspirin or ibuprofen)

Water Bottle or Thermos flask (1 to 1.5 litres recommended)

Sunglasses (Cat 3 or 4 rating) with retaining strap

Goggles (lenses for flat light, poor weather)

Sun cream and lip block

Sun Hat

Ski scraper and wax for skis and skin

Ski straps for fastening the poles to the skis during transport.

Extra Equipment for the Hut

Small wash kit. Toothbrush/toothpaste

T shirt for evening hut wear

Money, Passport, Alpine Club/BMC membership if you are a member

Sheet sleeping bag (silk)- obligatory in most huts

Ear plugs - optional

Camera

Phone and charger (3 pin Swiss standard)

Snow Analysis Equipment (one set between 2 which I can provide):

2m foldable ruler plastic

Thermometer (cooking thermometers are the best most easily available)

Field book (for recording the snow profile)

Crystal screen

Loop (magnifying glass)

Pencil 2H or HB

30cms Ruler, pencil, and erasure for plotting the snow profile.

Technical Equipment

- *Avalanche Transceiver and spare batteries. Mammut (Barryvox S or Pulse recommended),
- *Snow shovel (metal blade)
- *Avalanche probe

Light helmet (recommended)

*Can be rented from me, please contact me to reserve. (CHF20 for the 3 days). I will supply ropes, group shelter, emergency radio, repair and first aid kit. I will have the maps and navigation tools.

SKI EQUIPMENT

Skis with ski touring bindings. Ski brakes are strongly recommended. Ski touring boots Ski Poles - fixed length are better than the telescopic as they are stronger. Big snow baskets essential.

Ski Crampons (also called harscheisen or couteau) are an essential touring accessory Skins - If these are cut to fit the ski then that is an advantage. It is important to only have the ski edges showing at the ski waist when the skins are fitted)

General Travel Equipment

Approach shoes - travelling and evening wear (need to withstand snowy pavements)

Spare clothes for wearing in the valley (during away courses we usually have one valley night in which to freshen up).

Duffel Bag (or suitcase) to leave luggage in when we are on the mountain
